
















Esteemed Members & Partners,






POLICY ADVOCACY ACHIEVEMENTS

- 1) The following Non Tariff Berries were resolved following EABC Secretariat intervention
- Denial of preferential market access to Tanzania via Mutukula for Movit Product Uganda Limited.
- Denial of importation of Network Chips/Plugs manufactured by Simplifi Network Limited by the Kenya Bureau of Standards
- Stoppage of 1000 tons of galvanized 32 gauge iron sheets manufactured by Roofings Limited by Tanzania Bureau of Standards (TBS)
- Denial of Import Permit Renewal for HMH Rainbow Limited by Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock Kenya
- 2) EABC took part in the Reginal Monitoring Committee (RMC) meeting on the elimination of NTBs in Dar es salaam from the 12th 15th October 2021
- Out of the 18 NTBs in the Time Bound Program, two were resolved namely:
- Exporters of mattresses are suddenly required to pay USD 1250 USD per mattress originating from Uganda
- Uganda charges Kenya manufactured excise books VAT at 18%. The VAT is not levied on Uganda's locally manufactured books. The discriminative VAT violates Article III of GATT 1994, Article 75(6) of the Treaty establishing the EAC and Article 15 of the EAC Customs Union Protocol as it subjects Kenyan manufactured products to VAT charges not charged on the same domestic product in Uganda.
- 8NTBs were registered as new.
- EABC urged the EAC partner States to expedite the conclusion and elimination of all outstanding NTBs.









3) EABC Policy Advocacy Agenda 2021/22

EABC secretariat developed the fifth EABC Policy Advocacy Agenda 2021/22 and presented it to the EAC Secretary-General and Council of Minister. The Agenda outlines key policy priorities our region must subscribe in order to enhance the recovery of our businesses and economies from the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and bolster intra-EAC trade and investment. **Download**

4) EABC Position Paper on Open Skies in the EAC

EABC position paper on open skies recommended EAC Partner States to fast-track the finalization and implementation of EAC Regulations on Liberalization of Air Transport Services, waive landing fees, excise duty on aviation fuel, navigation, landing, parking and COVID-19 related fees in order to lower flight costs and ease doing business. <u>Download</u>

5) EABC in partnership with AERC organized a Webinar on Regional Perspectives on Trade & Investment Recovery amidst COVID-19.

The webinar assessed the impact of COVID-19 on business sectors. The webinar discussion revealed intra-EAC trade dropped by 5.5% in 2020 due to COVID-19. EABC urged for more public-private dialogue and championing of Buy East African Campaign to drive the economic recovery agenda of the EAC bloc. <u>Watch Webinar</u>

6) EABC Policy Paper on EAC Common External Tariff

EABC developed and presented a policy paper on EAC Common External Tariff to the Dedicated Session of Permanent Secretaries from the EAC Partner States held on 12th November at EAC Headquarters in Arusha, Tanzania. EAC Partner States agreed to adopt a 4-band tariff structure of 0%, 10%; 25% and 30% or 35% as the maximum tariff. The dedicated session of Permanent Secretaries from the EAC Partner States aimed to unlock the stalemate on the maximum tariff rate for the EAC CET, however, the meeting ended with no consensus on the percentage for the 4th band (maximum the tariff rate) and awaits the decision of the upcoming Council of Ministers meeting in Arusha. EABC policy paper urged the EAC Partner States to adopt the 35% threshold for the 4th band to promote industrialization in the region. Download







7) EABC-Afreximbank- AfCFTA Trade Opportunities Meeting & Launch of the Africa Customer due Diligence Platform (MANSA Repository Platform) in the EAC Partner States.

8) AfCFTA Secretariat adopts Tripartite Position on the participation of the private sector in AfCFTA

EABC participated in the 1st Coordination Meeting of the Heads of Regional Economic Communities (RECs) on the Implementation of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) held in Accra – Ghana on 18th – 19th September 2021 and presented the proposed private sector engagement mechanism for the AfCFTA. The Heads of Regional Economic Communities (RECs) came up with the following resolutions:

- The rules of engagement for Business Councils at the continental level should be re-negotiate them participate in policy organs meeting i,e their participation to go beyond observers' status
- AfCFTA State Parties to review the relevant legal instruments of the AfCFTA Agreement to recognize
 Africa Business Council and facilitate them to participate in the policy organs meeting as a substantive
 participant.
- Head office of the African Business Council (AfCB) should be relocated to Accra Ghana to facilitate a closer working relationship with AfCFTA Secretariat.
- AfCFTA State Parties to conclude or fast-track the discussions on trade instruments especially on tariff elimination and Rules of origin





TECHNICAL POLICY ADVOCACY ENGAGEMENTS

- 1) EABC represented members' concerns in the EAC Sectoral Committee on Customs pre-budget, tariffs, CET, single customs territory and One-Stop Border Post.
- 2) EABC in partnership with the East African Manufacturers Association Network organized the meeting to agree on maximum CET rate

Majority of Manufacturers Associations agreed to push for 35% as the Maximum CET rate while Rwanda supported 30%

3) EABC participated in the Extra-Ordinary Forum of the EAC CODEX held from 24th to 27th August 2021

The meeting prepared EAC positions for the upcoming 52nd Codex Committee for Food Additives, 46th Codex Committee for Food Labelling and 27th Codex Committee on Fats and Oils.

4) EABC took part in the Regional Harmonization meeting of the East African Standard Technical Committee meeting on fish and fish products held 20th -24th September 2021

Harmonized standards on fish and standards related NTBs addressed

- EABC held a meeting with the Director-General of Tanzania Bureau of Standards Dr. Athuman Ngenya and agreed to have a designated officer liaise with EABC on standard matters.
